Tribute to Bruce MacFarlane

The entire Uplands community would like to pay tribute to Bruce MacFarlane, our charismatic, enthusiastic and large-hearted Chairman who sadly passed away in May 2022. Bruce first joined the Board in 2016 and was tasked with chairing the Finance Committee. He soon proved to be a true visionary, bringing his intimate knowledge of banking and finance to the school environment. It was through Bruce's sound financial acumen and judgement that Uplands was able to weather a very tough two Covid years. Where most schools suffered financially during Covid, Uplands was very proudly able to assist many families and much of our community by the sound financial platform Bruce had guided the school towards during his tenure on the Finance Committee.

Bruce was appointed Chairman of the Board in November 2018 whereupon he once again proved to be dynamic, decisive and a true visionary in the scholastic environment. One of Bruce's greatest contributions included driving the vision to create "One School", an Uplands that encompasses the Pre-Preparatory, Preparatory, College and Uplands Outreach. Bruce was extremely passionate about Uplands, and he firmly believed in the aspirational strategic goal of Uplands becoming the pre-eminent co-educational Private Day and Boarding school in Africa. Bruce's vision for Uplands encompassed the traditions that date back to 1928 with a progressive, contemporary style of education, mixed with highly innovative educational facilities in the relaxed country family feel of the Lowveld and he dedicated

a great deal of time and energy to realising this goal.

Bruce will leave a great void at Uplands, as a highly respected individual in the Uplands community and also as someone who could light up a room with his energetic presence. Under Bruce's Chairmanship over a relatively short space of time, the Board has created the foundation for the current leadership team to flourish. Bruce brought the Anglican church and the schools closer together, he has driven transformation across the campus and inspired all around him to look at education differently.

Bruce taught us that leaders have passion, courage, brain and heart. They love what they do and they "live for the now." His dynamic style could not but impact on each and every one of the Uplands community who had the privilege of meeting him. He was constantly striving for a winning formula, a special combination of nurturing the unique spirit of each child, whilst honouring the history of the school, enhancing the quality of academics through staff development, and ensuring that everyone was enjoying the wide range of activities on the campus all incorporated in one unique offering. Bruce's legacy will be celebrated by those who know and love Uplands. We remember a great and influential person who has done so much for the school and our community. Bruce taught us to celebrate the positive and to always challenge ourselves to become brighter and better.

In 2022, Uplands Outreach celebrated 28 years since our founding by a small group of visionaries at Uplands Preparatory School. Boosting education outcomes for all children through the sustained empowerment of educators, especially school leaders, is at the heart of our work.

The Uplands Foundation Bench Project

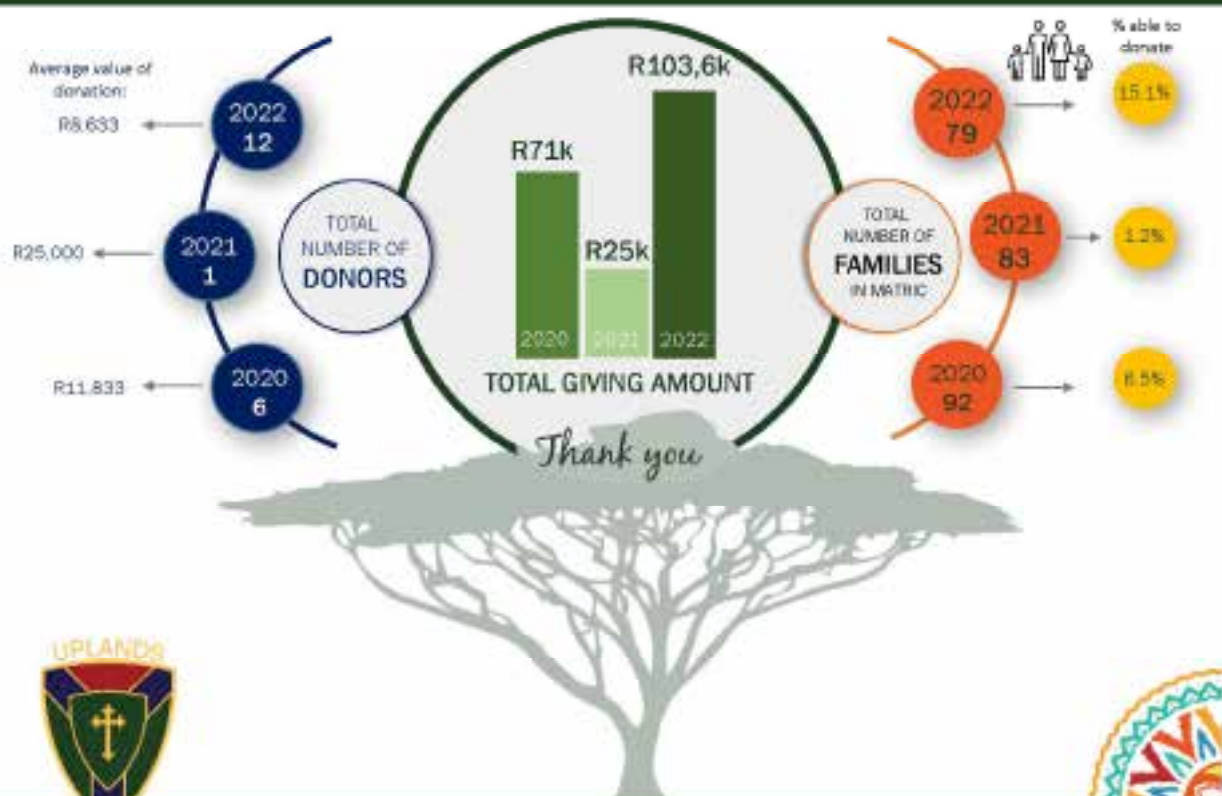

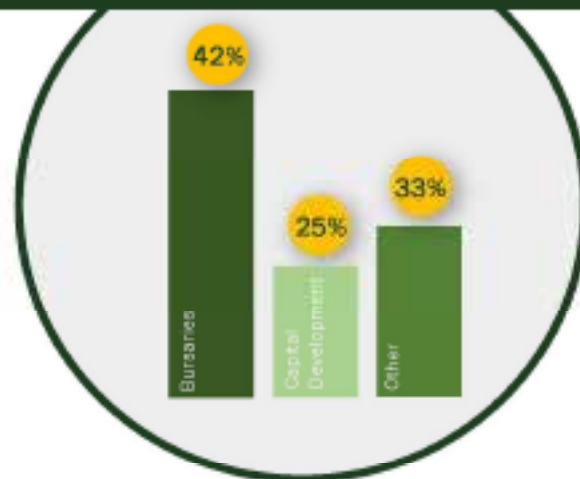

The online-giving-portal is the next step in developing this resourceful tool. In order to remain keen and eager to achieve that which is set out by the Uplands Foundation Strategy, the team are focused on possible opportunities that allow us to think out of the box. UPPA Golf Day and Ladies Afternoon

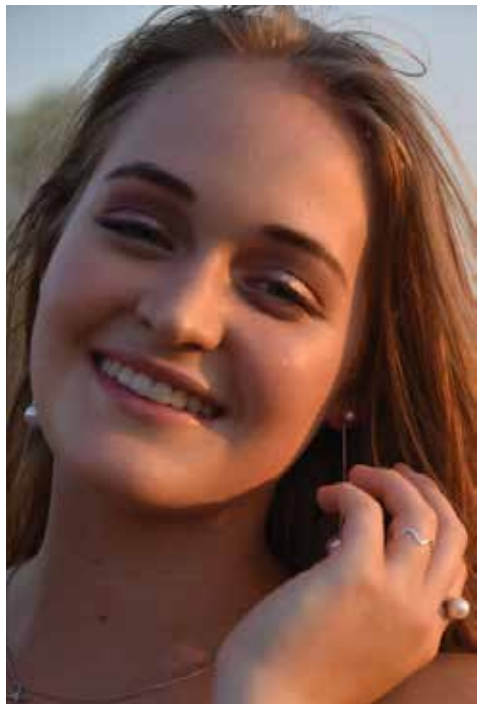

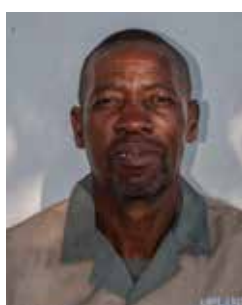

Pastoral Care Report

The pastoral care of pupils is most effective when there is open communication between the school and the parents. The tutor system that we have implemented at Uplands allows for parents to have one point of contact for all of their child's needs. These smaller groups allow the teachers to get to know every child as an individual and to follow our credo of "Treat every child as though they were your own". Through the use of our merit and demerit system, we hope to catch children doing things right, and work on recognising and rewarding positive behaviour rather than focus on a punitive system. The demerits also offer an opportunity for growth, and tutor-pupil interviews are held if a negative trend in behaviour is

identified. Our discipline system aims to effect long-term behaviour change rather than immediate punishment.

During the year, we noted that our children need to develop more resilience when dealing with conflict in their peer groups. We are pleased to offer the BounceBack programme in our Life Skills lessons, which will help the children develop the resilience needed and give them coping skills to effectively manage the conflict that they experience in their daily lives. Smaller BounceBack groups are also offered to specific children in the afternoon programme, to assist those who need additional support.

The most challenging aspect of discipline this year has been around social media. The majority of severe discipline issues were started on social media, usually late at night or on weekends. Although this is not happening at home, the social and emotional fallout is occurring in our classes. There are many benefits to social media and smart devices, but as with most things in life, moderation and management are key to making them effective. Parents are encouraged to make use of the resources available on-line to assist them in safely introducing a device and social media to their children.

Senior Phase Academics Report

Each school has a unique ethos tying in the traditions, community and vision of the school. Coming to Uplands presented the very real challenge of retaining the excellent teaching and learning being done in our classrooms, while aspiring to provide an education that will prepare our pupils for an unpredictable future! Initially, two needs struck me. One, the need to build a sense of ownership of the educational process in the pupils and two, the need to develop more independent thought.

Part of a forward-thinking education means we offer contemporary subjects like Innovation and Information Technology. But it also means that we place the pupil at the centre of the learning experience. Gone is the “chalk and talk” style of teaching where the teacher, as a central dominant figure, “disseminates” knowledge to pupils who receive and commit that information to memory unthinkingly. Rather, education should be a process of discovery, whereby a pupil is exposed to and engages with knowledge, and learns in time to apply it. Hence, we decided to bring our pupils into

our parent-teacher meetings in the first term. In the second term, we expected them to lead discussions, to a greater or lesser extent, depending on their Grade. While many of the pupils, and some parents, found this challenging, the process served as a learning experience, and in many instances, left our pupils with a great sense of pride in their work and achievements, which they shared with their parents. Pupils are also able to share their aspirations and set realistic goals with their parents in this forum.

Unfortunately, much of our current system of education was designed in Europe at the time of the Industrial Revolution, where the very real intention was to ensure pupils would become adults who could carry out instructions with accuracy and without questioning, critically evaluating or taking a creative stance. Skills demanded for success in the 21st century might well be diametrically opposed to those goals.

We are creating an environment where we intentionally encourage our pupils to think for themselves. An important opportunity for this is at report times. Our reports should

not only be a communication from the school to parents but can also involve the pupil undergoing self-reflection. What better opportunity and motivation for learning than for pupils to have to think about how they have done, where they can improve and how to go about it. This process becomes so much more meaningful than a list of marks achieved in various subjects..

2022 also saw a step-up in our approach to languages with the writing of our first isiZulu cycle tests and exams. We also implemented the equal allocation of teaching time across the First Additional Languages. We feel that this will prepare our Grade 7 leavers for their College experience where they will have to choose an additional language that they will then take to Matric level.

Working with young, enthusiastic minds is a privilege every teacher should cherish. At Uplands, we do so, in our quest to ensure that today's thinking child will indeed become tomorrow's achiever.

Art

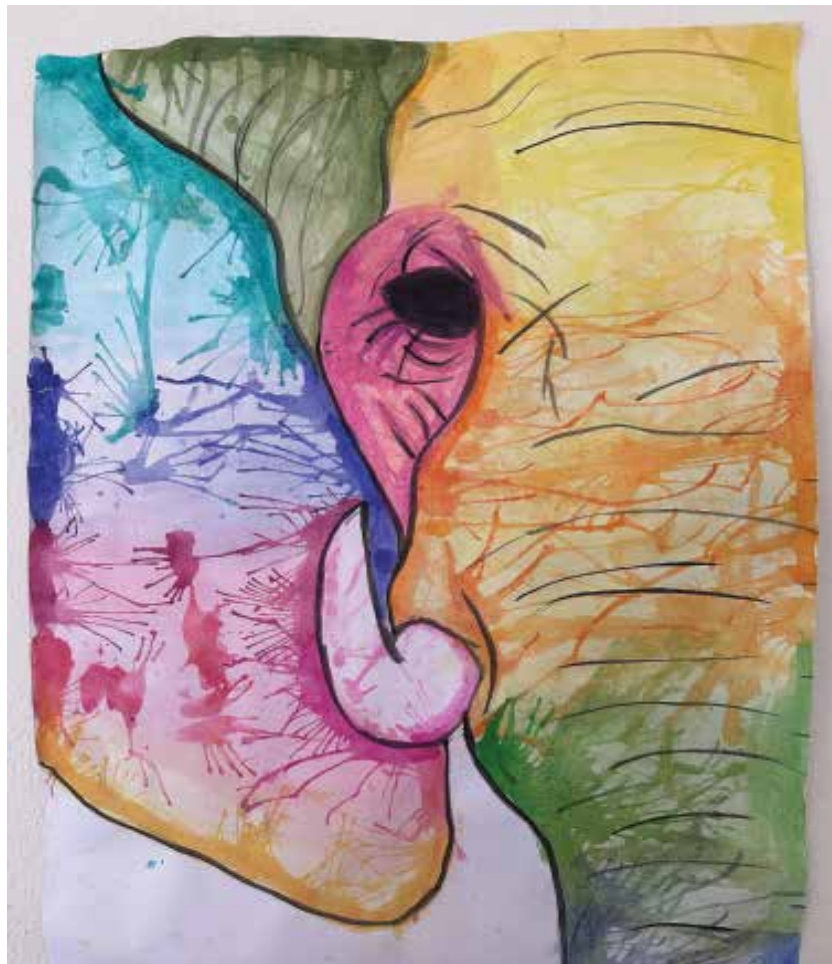
With a focus on contemporary artist Kimmy Cantrell, the Grade 4s created abstract mask sculptures using recycled cardboard. The children had to apply various art elements and design principles to organise an aesthetically successful design, with a special focus on proportion, shape, variety, contrast, balance and pattern, form and repetition.

In solidarity with Ukraine, Uplands launched “Project Sunflower”. Every child in the school created a sunflower, and collectively over a thousand sunflowers were made. These were on display at Founder’s Evening. Sunflowers come in a range of warm colours, from golden to orange, red and purple, and they are most well-known for their vibrant yellow colour. This provided a great opportunity for the children to explore a wide colour palette and discover different colour variations.

The Grade 4, 6 and 7 children used oil pastels to create bubble drawings for an exhibit that will be displayed in the Art Room. They began with a study of what bubbles look like, paying close attention to what they all have in common. The children had to concentrate on drawing perfectly round bubbles with rings of iridescent colours following the contour of the circle. The addition of white highlights, and making sure to leave at least part of the bubble black, created a three-dimensional, transparent look.

The Grade 5s’ imaginative thinking and creative problem-solving skills were encouraged while designing and constructing giant insects from repurposed cardboard boxes.

The Grade 5s participated in a “mystery” art game inspired by the popular TV show “Chopped”. In teams, they had to make art using “mystery ingredients”. They competed in three rounds, with two teams being eliminated after each round. The final team remaining were the Chopped Champions.



The Grade 6s were introduced to the basics of digital design through the Canva Platform. Canva is a powerful graphic design tool that works to simplify the process of digital design, making it ideal for use in the classroom. I have thoroughly enjoyed the term and getting to know this dynamic group of children.

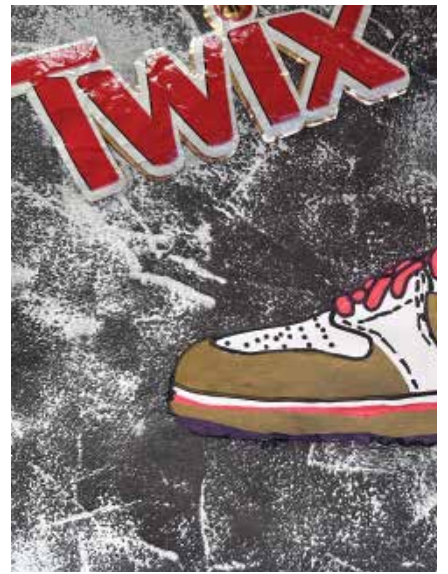
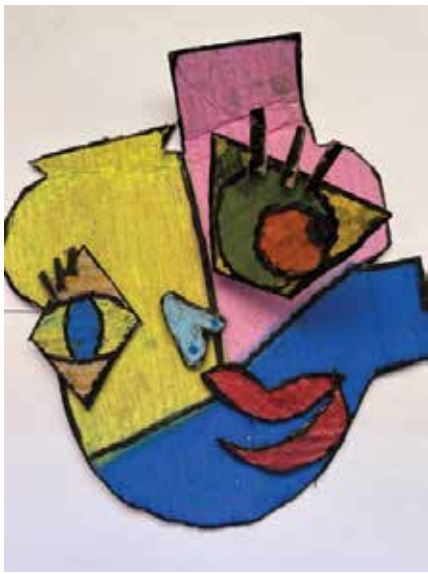

Set upon a 110-hectare countryside estate in White River in Mpumalanga, the school has been in existence since 1928 and has deep connections within the surrounding communities through Uplands Outreach which works collaboratively in two Mpumalanga circuits with school leaders, teachers, and pupils in a proven systemic alignment approach to enable continuous learning.

Competitiveness is an important skill and preparing our pupils for

He comments that “this facility will allow us to further develop the holistic athlete with a core focus on sport performance and wellness.” The highly qualified staff members will

facilitate personalised programmes to support the pupils in their various sports and fitness regimes.

Designed by the well-known Lowveld architect, Mr Gerhard Jooste, of GJ Architects, the building has a definitive architectural style which was designed to fit into the Uplands landscape and ensures that the

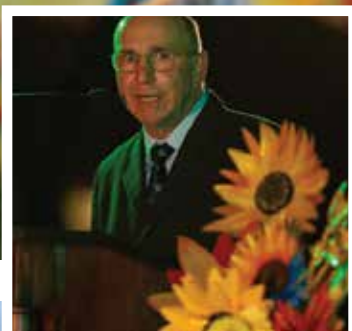
Founders' Evening

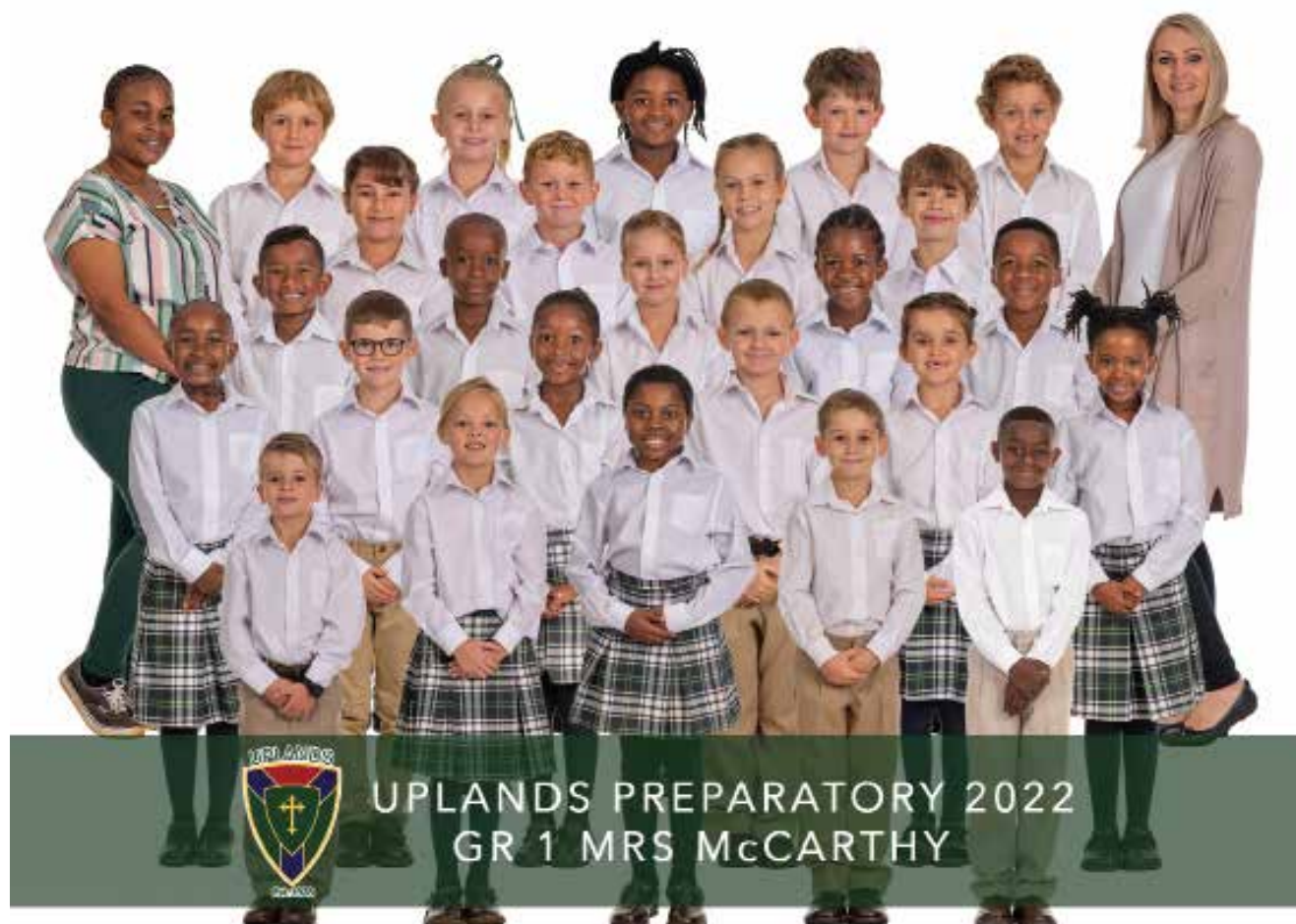
Transport Day
